

wore all of the green we could find in honor of St. Patrick's Day and dressed up with a partner for Twin Day! It was extremely fun and generated lots of school spirit!






LMS Pride Day


Read Across America






On March 30, I had the privilege of interviewing Mr. Vaughan, Leicester Middle School's guidance counselor about his annual Red Sox predictions for their upcoming season. Mr. Vaughan replied by telling me that he thinks "it's going to be a fun season to watch the Red Sox." Eduardo Rodrigues has a ton of talent, but continues to get injuries throughout his career. Then you have [Drew] Pomeranz who's their fifth starter, at present and he has been injury prone." "There are a lot of question marks around" those three.

Next up is Sharp Shooter! Who shall win this? This event is one of the funniest to


watch with all the kids running around trying to shoot the cups down. 7th wins with 5 points and 6th and 8th tie for 2nd place each getting 3 points.


Now we move onto Lion King. The first part of this event is an obstacle course and the second part was Extinction! The 7th grade has a couple small violations so they are
